480,000 People around the World to Challenge the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test in December

The number of overseas applicants increased by 35,000 people

The Japan Foundation conducts the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) on Sunday, December 4, 2016 in 217 cities of 69 countries and regions outside Japan. JLPT is the largest Japanese-language test in the world to certify language proficiency of non-native speakers. This year marks the 32nd anniversary of the establishment of the JLPT. In comparison with the test held in December 2015, the number of applicants has increased by 35,000 overseas and 36,000 in Japan. In Southeast Asia, it has increased remarkably (23%), and in East Asia, including China and Korea which have the largest number of applicants in the world, it has increased by 7% compared with the previous year. These increases demonstrate growing interest in JLPT overseas.

The number of overseas applicants:

-The number of overseas applicants is 331,445. The increase rate is 23% in Southeast Asia, and 12% in the countries and regions outside Japan.

-To meet one of requirements for the nurse/caregiver candidates of Indonesia, the Philippines, and Vietnam under the EPA.
