Inaugurated in 1973, the year following the Japan Foundation's establishment, fiscal year 2023 will mark the 50th anniversary of the Japan Foundation Awards. The awards are presented to individuals or organizations that have significantly contributed and are expected to contribute to the promotion of international mutual understanding and friendship through their academic, artistic or cultural activities.

#### **Eligible Candidates**

Candidates must be an individual person or an organization established inside or outside of Japan. <u>Self-nominations</u>, including nominations of an organization or head of an organization to which the nominator belongs, will not be considered.

## Ineligible individuals and/or organizations

- (1) Individuals who are currently employed by their national or local governments, as well as those employed by similar organizations (e.g. governmental corporations) and whose main occupation pertains to international activities (excluding those in research-related positions). However, individuals who currently fall under the conditions stated above may be nominated if they made contributions conforming to the award criteria with a different affiliation or position in the past.
- (2) Domestic or overseas organizations that are national or local governmental agencies as well as similar bodies.
- (3) Domestic organizations that are mostly publicly-funded, those that were established by law, as well as those with a strong public character.
- (4) Organizations supported by the Japanese government or the Japan Foundation that receive an amount of subsidies representing more than half of their annual budget.
- (5) Organizations that are closely related, organizationally or financially, to their nominator.
- (6) Individuals and organizations whose main activities are profit-making, religious, political or electoral.
- (7) Individuals and organizations whose main field of activity is different than the Japan Foundation's, such as scientific or technological fields.
- (8) Individuals and organizations whose main purposes are recreational activities or friendship through exchange between sister cities or sister schools, as well as those who perform activities that benefit to a restricted specific group or association.
- (9) Joint activities by two or more organizations may be nominated as a single nomination only if their engagements are justifiably regarded as an inseparable whole.

### Eligible fields of activities

Candidates must be thoroughly involved in the following fields of activities that represent the core activities of the Japan Foundation: "Arts and Cultural Exchange"; "Japanese-Language Education Overseas"; and, "Japanese Studies and Global Partnerships" or in an interdisciplinary manner.

## Each field is explained as below:

#### I. Arts and Cultural Exchange

Individuals or organizations that have significantly contributed to international cultural exchange and the enhancement of mutual understanding between Japan and other countries through the introduction or promotion of Japanese arts and culture abroad, or creative activities such as joint research or coproduction projects.

#### II. Japanese-Language Education Overseas

Individuals or organizations that have significantly contributed to the progress of Japanese language education and research, the improvement of the international status of Japanese language as well as the enhancement of mutual understanding between Japan and other countries through remarkable commitment to Japanese language education and research as well as continued efforts to train and organize Japanese language teachers, or through translations, writings in Japanese or other activities strongly connected to the Japanese language.

#### III. Japanese Studies and Global Partnerships

Individuals or organizations that have significantly contributed to foster better understanding of Japan through education and research and strengthen intellectual networks between Japan and foreign countries through original and authoritative accomplishments and the development of Japanese studies abroad.

#### **Selection Process**

After primary screening by panels of specialists, a selection committee consisting of experts commissioned by the Japan Foundation will select the recipients. The results will be officially announced in July, 2023.

#### Selection Criteria

Recipients will be selected based on the following criteria:

1	Accomplishments	Recipients must have made outstanding contributions to the promotion of international mutual understanding and friendship inside or outside of Japan.
2	Continuity and Potential	Recipients are expected to continue their activities and further promote and contribute to international cultural exchange.
3	Pervasiveness	Results of the recipient's activities must benefit as many people, not only a determined region or organization.

#### Robert LEPAGE

(Actor, Playwright, theatre and movie Director) [Canada]

In addition to being an actor, Robert Lepage is a director, playwright, film-maker and the artistic leader of Ex Machina (Latin for "from the machine"), a creative collective he founded in Canada with activities spanning the domains of theater, opera and multimedia shows. Ex Machina is particularly known for its unique productions that boldly incorporates the latest technologies. The company is wide acclaimed throughout the world for its approach that defies conventional wisdom.

Lepage has a long history of relationships with Japan, such as the performance in Japan of his work *The Seven Streams of the River Ota*, about Hiroshima, and had many collaborations with Japanese artists through which he has had a significant influence on the Japanese performing arts. These activities have contributed to the promotion of mutual international understanding. Accordingly, we present him with the Japan Foundation Award to encourage his future endeavors.



### Goenawan Mohamad

(Poet, Writer and Painter) [Indonesia]

Goenawan Mohamad is one of the intellectual giants of his generation in Asia. With his achievements as a journalist, civic activist, poet, and playwright, he is Indonesia's leading intellectual with wide ranging talents. Among those achievements, Goenawan launched the weekly magazine *Tempo* in 1971 through which he continued to stress the importance of freedom and democracy in Indonesia. His wide-ranging activities and versatility covered the fields of poetry, drama, the fine arts, and writing, each in which he exercised his talents and through which he made a contribution to art in general. Goenawan came to Japan under the Asia Leadership Fellowship co-sponsored by the Japan Foundation and the International House of Japan, and he has expanded his intellectual exchange with Japan in a variety of domains since that time. Goenawan Mohamad's presence in intellectual exchange between Indonesia and Japan within a global perspective focused on Asia will remain significant moving forward.
