Eligible Candidates	Candidates must be an individual person or an organization established inside or outside of Japan. <u>Self-nominations will not be considered.</u>
Ineligible individuals and/or organizations	<ol> <li>Individuals who are currently employed by their national or local governments, as well as those employed by similar organizations (e.g. governmental corporations) and whose main occupation pertains to international activities (excluding those in research-related positions). However, individuals who currently fall under the conditions stated above may be nominated if they made contributions conforming to the award criteria with a different affiliation or position in the past.</li> <li>Domestic or overseas organizations that are national or local governmental agencies as well as similar bodies.</li> <li>Domestic organizations that are mostly publicly-funded, those that were established by law, as well as those with a strong public character.</li> <li>Organizations supported by the Japanese government or the Japan Foundation that receive an amount of subsidies representing more than half of their annual budget.</li> <li>Individuals and organizations whose main field of activity is different than the Japan Foundation's.</li> <li>Individuals and organizations whose main purposes are recreational activities or friendship through exchange between sister cities or sister schools, as well as those who perform activities that benefit to a restricted specific group or association.</li> <li>Joint activities by two or more organizations may be nominated as a single nomination only if their engagements are justifiably regarded as an inseparable whole.</li> </ol>
Eligible fields of activities	Candidates must be thoroughly involved in the following fields of activities that represent the core activities of the Japan Foundation: "Arts and Cultural Exchange"; "Japanese-Language Education Overseas"; and, "Japanese Studies and Global Partnerships" or in an interdisciplinary manner.
Each field is explained as below;	<ul> <li>I. Arts and Cultural Exchange</li> <li>Individuals or organizations that have significantly contributed to international cultural exchange and the enhancement of mutual understanding between Japan and other countries through the introduction or promotion of Japanese arts and culture abroad, or creative activities such as joint research or coproduction projects. We particularly welcome nominations from fields that have not seen many awardees in the past, such as pop culture, architecture, design, and sports.</li> <li>II. Japanese-Language Education Overseas</li> <li>Individuals or organizations that have significantly contributed to the progress of Japanese language education and research, the improvement of the international status of Japanese language as well as the enhancement of mutual understanding between Japan and other countries through remarkable commitment to Japanese language education and research as well as continued efforts to train and organize Japanese language teachers, or through translations, writings in Japanese or other activities strongly connected to the Japanese language.</li> <li>III. Japanese Studies and Global Partnerships</li> <li>Individuals or organizations that have significantly contributed to foster better understanding of Japan through education and research and strengthen intellectual networks between Japan and foreign countries through original and authoritative accomplishments and the development of Japanese studies abroad.</li> </ul>
Selection Process	After primary screening by panels of specialists, a selection committee consisting of experts commissioned by the Japan Foundation will select the recipients. The results will be officially announced in July, 2025.

	1 Accomplishments	Recipients must have made outstanding contributions to the promotion of international mutual understanding and friendship inside or outside of Japan.
	2 Continuity and Potential	Recipients are expected to continue their activities and further promote and contribute to international cultural exchange.
	3 Pervasiveness	Results of the recipient's activities must benefit as many people, not only a determined region or organization.

# Recipients of The Japan Foundation Awards 2024

The presentation ceremony was held in Tokyo on October 16, 2024

### • SHIOTA Chiharu (Artist) [Japan]

SHIOTA Chiharu is a Berlin-based artist who is active internationally and who creates works that explore the fundamental theme of "life and death." A work she made while studying in Germany in 1997, which employed her own body as a component of the work, marked her starting point as an artist. As exemplified by works such as "Memories of Skin," a work composed of gigantic dresses coated in mud that she presented at the Yokohama Triennale in 2001, and "During Sleep," a work involving 30 beds that she showed at Switzerland's Museum of Art Lucerne in 2002, Shiota's works hint at "life and death," and as such they have been greeted with astonishment by large numbers of viewers. Shiota continues to show a large number of her distinctive works in countries around the world, and in particular "The Key in the Hand," a work in which tens of thousands of keys were connected with a mass of red threads, which she presented at the International Art Exhibition - La Biennale di Venezia, won high praise for carrying a powerful visual impact and unifying the wishes or memories of people. Shiota's activities put international exchange into practice, and she has also emerged as a driving force encouraging women to flourish internationally. Against the backdrop of this extensive and remarkable track record, we expect Shiota to continue to make great strides in the future also, and accordingly, we believe she is a worthy recipient of the Japan Foundation Award.

#### Association of Japanese Language Teachers of Mongolia [Mongolia]

The Association of Japanese Language Teachers of Mongolia has been making major contributions to the development and popularization of Japanese language education throughout Mongolia. Beginning with the establishment in 1975 of a Japanese language course offered by the National University of Mongolia's Department of Literature, Japanese language education has spread widely from elementary school education through to higher educational institutions in Mongolia. The Association, which was established in 1993, currently boasts 363 members and holds Japanese language speech contests and education symposiums in partnership with local Japan-related institutions and other entities. Furthermore, since 2000 the Association has been active as the implementing agency for the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test, and it has also been focusing efforts on developing and popularizing the "Nihongo Dekirumon" series of educational materials for elementary and secondary education based on the JF Standard for Japanese-Language Education, and is working to popularize the Standard. It holds a diverse range of Japanese language education-related events every year, and is endeavoring to enhance the level of Japanese language education. We chose to present the Japan Foundation Award to the Association in expectation of its increased activity and development in the future.

## • The Sainsbury Institute for the Study of Japanese Arts and Cultures (SISJAC) [U.K.]

The Sainsbury Institute for the Study of Japanese Arts and Cultures (SISJAC) is a research institution that was founded in 1999 through the financial support of Sir Robert and Lady Sainsbury to promote research, publication and exchanges relating to Japanese arts and cultures, and it is currently evolving as one of the largest research institutions relating to these fields in Europe. Thus far a large number of fellows and visiting researchers from around the world, including Japan, have been enrolled at the Institute, and number over 90 since its founding. Furthermore, as a result of its educational partnership with the University of East Anglia, it has also set up an MA in Interdisciplinary Japanese Studies course. Its library boasts a collection of over 50,000 historical records, and it is currently moving to digitalize them. In recent years the Sainsbury Institute for the Study of Japanese Arts and Cultures has also been displaying flexibility by expanding its areas of interest to include archaeology, manga, anime and other topics, and in this and other ways the Institute promises to be immensely active as a core institution of Japanese research in Europe from here on also. Accordingly, we consider it worthy of being awarded the Japan Foundation Award.
