Starting from fiscal year 2014, the Japan Foundation carries out the "Japan-U.S. Young Creators Exchange" Program to cover four major areas of 'Cool Japan': fashion, design, anime, and art. This time, the Program will focus on an area of design and dispatch its second group to the U.S. in April 2014. The group members consist of five young designers who won the Good Design Award and have gained an international acclaim.
