

KAKEHASHI Project: Japan-U.S. Youth Exchange Project to invite 78 U.S. student creators for the first time

In June 2014, the Japan Foundation, for the first time, will carry out "Student Creators Exchange (Invitation) Program" for university and graduate school students studying art or art-related subjects in the U.S. A total of 78 selected student creators, from six of the U.S. institutions, will visit Japan.

With the aim of learning the charms of Japanese culture and of incorporating these lessons into their future creation, participants, the aspiring creators, will conduct exchange activities with Japan's art school students of the same generation, and will meet Japanese young professional creators and businesspersons to experience the forefront of the creative industries. Being divided into small groups, the participants will also visit either of Kyoto, Gifu, or Ishikawa to deepen their understanding of traditional cultures in Japan's regions, such as textiles and crafts. On the last day of the Program, all of the participants will gather and discuss about Japan's 'strength' and 'value'.

In addition to the following exchange activities and visits to local cities, we will provide an orientation for all the Program participants on Wednesday, June 11. It would be appreciated if you could cover the Program and such topics as the participant's interests and expectations toward Japan, which have led their decision to join the Program.
