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The Japan Foundation Asia Center & Tokyo International Film Festival to Showcase Cinema with Music of Southeast Asia

The Japan Foundation Asia Center will present CROSSCUT ASIA, the Asian film showcase series during the 31st Tokyo International Film Festival (TIFF), which will be held from Thursday, October 25 through Saturday, November 3. CROSSCUT ASIA series was jointly launched by the Asia Center and the TIFF in 2014. The fifth edition this year will showcase Asian films focusing on a rich variety of musical genres with the series entitled **Soundtrip to Southeast Asia**.



The works include a HIP HOP from the Philippines, popular Isan band music from

Thailand that has drawn much attention when the film **Bangkok Nites** was introduced in 2017, and Cambodian pop songs, reflecting historical and present-day Southeast Asia. One eye-opener in the lineup, **Season of the Devil**, **is the latest film from Filipino auteur Lav Diaz**. His subsequent films received much critical attention and many awards from leading festivals. *From What Is Before* earned him the Golden Leopard at Locarno in 2014, *A Lullaby to the Sorrowful Mystery* took the Silver Bear at Berlin in 2016, and *The Woman Who Left* won the Golden Lion at Venice, also in 2016. Diaz's must-see new **Season of the Devil** features a cappella songs that resonate against the black-and-white cinematography.

CROSSCUT ASIA series showcase Asian films with a focus on specific countries, directors, or themes. Following the first three editions, which featured works from Thailand, the Philippines, and Indonesia, the fourth edition encompassed a larger area of Southeast Asia, with works from young filmmakers in Southeast Asia recommended by maestros such as Brillante Ma Mendoza (Philippines), Tran Anh Hung (Vietnam) and Apichatpong Weerasethakul (Thailand).
