



Shochiku NIHONBUYO Lab., krage, and AKATSUKI to Perform in Cambodia, Laos, and Vietnam

~Delivering Japan's Appeal to Next Generations∼

The Japan Foundation (JF) will implement the Partnership to Co-create a Future with the Next Generation: WA Project 2.0 as comprehensive people-to-people exchange programs aimed at promoting exchanges between the future generations of Japan and ASEAN countries and cultivating human resources. The WA Project 2.0 will constructively continue the work of the WA Project: Toward Interactive Asia through Fusion and Harmony, the cultural exchange programs with Asia that are commonly known as Japan Foundation Asia Center projects, which JF carried out from 2014-2023.

As one part of the WA Project 2.0, JF will send Shochiku NIHONBUYO Lab., which creates pieces and performances that promote the appeal of NIHONBUYO (Japanese traditional dance) to an international audience, to Cambodia; krage, a female singer widening her sphere of activities by utilizing a serene singing voice while drawing fully on her multilingualism, to Laos; and AKATSUKI, a Japanese music ensemble made up of spirited performing musicians who are active on the front lines, to Vietnam, in order to hold performance projects showcasing Japan's diverse culture to the younger generations in each countries.

In these countries, these artists will convey their distinctive artform to the local communities via a range of activities, including participation in local Japan festivals; promoting understanding of Japanese culture via visits to schools where the NIHONGO Partners Program (https://asiawa.jpf.go.jp/en/partners/) is active and interacting with their students; and by holding exchanges with local artists.

NIHONBUYO is a Japanese traditional dance originating from Kabuki but unique for the contributions made by female artists in furthering its development. It is characterized by three elements: Odori, Mai, and Shigusa. The "Shochiku NIHONBUYO Lab." creates pieces and performances that promote the appeal of NIHONBUYO to an international audience.

In Cambodia, Shochiku NIHONBUYO Lab. will take the stage to interweave music from all ages and



countries, including not only classical NIHONBUYO compositions but also music from 'In the Life of Music,' a film set in Cambodia, as well as anime songs and classical music, to deliver a show that allows audiences to readily enjoy NIHONBUYO's various expressions. We hope you will look forward to this performance by these up-and-coming young NIHONBUYO performers.

AKATSUKI is an ensemble of four spirited artists who are currently active on the frontlines, coming together for this project with the hope of becoming a foundation for cultural exchange with Asia through Japan's traditional music and instruments. The name "AKATSUKI" means the early, predawn hours in Japanese, as well as the striking red color that the moon takes on as it approaches the horizon.

During their visit to Vietnam, they are aiming have this project become the dawn of genuine cultural exchange between the two countries.
