



Exploring Leadership Adaptation Strategies in the Indo-Pacific: 14 Next-generation Researchers and Leaders from 11 Nations to Visit Okinawa, Tokyo, and Osaka

As part of the Japan Foundation Indo-Pacific Partnership Program (JFIPP), the Japan Foundation and the East-West Center will host a study tour in Japan from September 7 to 13, welcoming 14 next-generation researchers and leaders from Japan and 10 Indo-Pacific countries. The tour will focus on leadership and adaptation and marks the final phase of the yearlong Indo-Pacific Leadership Lab program (IPLL).

This IPLL program is co-organized by the Japan Foundation and the East-West Center (EWC), an education and research institution headquartered in Honolulu. The program provides research and networking opportunities for next-generation researchers and leaders throughout the year.

The fellows from 11 countries (Australia, Bhutan, Cambodia, India, Japan, Malaysia, Pakistan, Solomon Islands, Sri Lanka, Timor-Leste, and the United States) previously completed weeklong workshops in Honolulu in December 2024 and in Fiji last April, where they shared insights regarding the threats to regions posed by environmental challenges and deepened their networks of experts from diverse backgrounds.

In Okinawa, fellows will engage in discussions with the **Okinawa Prefectural Government** on environmental adaptation policies, visit the **Kumejima Deep Ocean Water Research Institute**, observe collaborative efforts led by the private sector, and meet with local researchers in Naha City.

In Tokyo, the itinerary includes meetings with the **Ministry of the Environment** and **NHK**, a visit the **Metropolitan Area Outer Underground Discharge Channel**, as well as discussions with researchers and professionals, followed by a reception hosted by the Japan

Foundation with invited officials and stakeholders. Following the program in Tokyo, some members of the cohort will travel to the **Osaka Expo 2025** to explore cutting-edge technologies and global perspectives on environmental sustainability.

The upcoming study tour in Japan will also be joined by Celeste Conners, the newly appointed President of the East-West Center, KANIE Norichika, IPLL Program Advisor and Professor at Keio University, and Ketty Loeb, IPLL Program Mentor and Assistant Professor at University of Hawai'i at Manoa.
