The dividing line in American society today is no longer the traditional ideological battle between conservatives and liberals. This disparity has become so severe that it has even led to the phenomenon of "deaths of despair" among working-class Americans.

As the United States grapples with these challenges, what path lies ahead for its national renewal?

To explore this question, Oren Cass—a prominent policy thinker who has been shaping public policy discussions in the U.S., particularly in collaboration with figures like Vice President J.D. Vance and Secretary of State Marco Rubio since their time in the Senate—will make his first visit to Japan to share his insights and approach.

The discussion will be moderated by Hirotsugu Aida, a historian of political thought and journalist, whose recent book Why Is Trump Still Supported? (Toyo Keizai) examines the enduring appeal of Trumpism.
