As the largest Japanese language proficiency test in the world, it is administered twice a year in more than 80 countries and regions, including Japan (with Japan Educational Exchanges and Services, a co-organizer, handling the domestic administration). The certification from the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) is used in various ways, including as reference material for immigration procedures to Japan, for credit or graduation qualifications in schools, for benefits in companies, and for social qualifications.

Overview	work in Japan. To learn practical Japanese, the textbook includes audio materials and real-life examples that are actually seen and used in daily life in Japan. Irodori covers three levels: Starter (A1), Elementary 1 & 2 (A2). PDF versions of all lessons and audio files are available for free download from the "Irodori" website. You can practice speaking with conversation videos in real-life situations, engage in interactive listening and reading exercises, and check your progress through review quizzes and tests. The 'Practice Content' section allows you to focus and practice on areas from four categories (vocabulary, kanji, grammar, and expressions) where you may be struggling or lacking confidence (can also practice on the " IRODORI Practice" app). The 'Support Content' section provides explanations for words and grammar during your studies, while the 'My Page' feature helps you track your learning progress and achievements to support your independent learning.	different sections of the program, as well as related content that is useful for teaching and learning Japanese.	to search for essential vocabularies and phrases used in the fields of nursing and caregiving, such as basic words used when working in hospitals and care facilities, common phrases for communicating with coworkers, and useful words for everyday life in Japan.	This is a test designed to assess the Japanese language skills needed to communicate in everyday life situations encountered by foreigners coming to Japan primarily for work. It assesses whether a person has the Japanese language proficiency to be able to engage in everyday conversation to a certain extent and handle daily life without difficulties (A2 level). The test can be used as proof of Japanese language proficiency when applying for the residence status of "Specified Skilled Worker (i)." The test is administered six times a year both overseas (in Asia) and in Japan, during designated testing periods set by each country. Questions are delivered and answered on computers at test centers in each country, and results are available immediately after the test is taken. The test is divided into four parts: "Script and Vocabulary," "Conversation and Expression," "Listening Comprehension," and "Reading Comprehension," providing a comprehensive assessment. The questions are based on the Can-do statements of the CEFR and the JF Standard for Japanese Language Education.
