

Unforgetting

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In reflecting about the collective silence surrounding the October 6 massacre which took place in Thammasat University, Bangkok in 1976, historian and former student activist Thongchai Winichakul characterises the 'unforgetting' as an inability to remember or to forget. Suspended in this liminal state, these are experiences that have to be repressed or suppressed because they do not cohere to articulating a socially meaningful memory under the existing regimes of truth.

Over the past decade, a younger generation of artists and social actors across Asia have begun to excavate the traumatic memories and experiences of their nations' histories, often going against the grain of official accounts and versions. Investigating events they never lived through, their projects can be read as attempts to recover silenced experiences and narratives, to reveal the complex afterlives of history, and to give shape to these moments and legacies of unforgetting.
