In the 10th century, a samurai travelling through the countryside with his wife is found stabbed to death in the shrubs in Yamashina, Kyoto. Testimonies of all four people involved -a robber, the samurai's wife, the deceased samurai who speaks through a miko (spiritualistic medium), and a woodcutter- are totally different. Humans tend to fabricate their tales to suit their own convenience, and the truth cannot be determined.

The unique structure of this film was shown at the 1951 Venice Film Festival. This was the first Japanese fictional film to be shown at an International Film Festival after the war, and it won the Grand Prix Award. It went on to win the Academy Award of U.S.A. as the Best Foreign Film, and thus the name of KUROSAWA AKIRA became known the world over. It was the first film that established the advance of Japanese films into the international scene.
