

370,000 people in 66 countries and regions to take the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test.

The number of applicants has increased by over 30% in Vietnam and Myanmar.

The Japan Foundation conducts the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) on Sunday, December 7, 2014 in 209 cities of 65 countries outside Japan. With a history of 30 years, JLPT is the largest comprehensive test of Japanese-language skills for non-native speakers and has been taken by 7,559,827 examinees so far.

The number of applications has increased by 19% in Southeast Asia and by 20% in South Asia.

Breaking it down by country, the percentage of increase is 37% in Vietnam, 38% in Myanmar and 28% in Sri Lanka. (Comparison with the number of applicants for December 2013)

Vietnam: Conducted in Hanoi, Ho Chi Minh and Da Nang. 23,232 Applicants (16,981 in Dec.2013; 37% increase) Myanmar: Conducted in Yangon. 5,636 Applicants (4,080 in Dec 2013; 38% increase) Sri Lanka: Conducted in Colombo. 1,753 Applicants (1,374 in Dec 2013; 28% increase)
