

355,000 in 65 Countries and Regions to Take the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test on December 1

The Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) has a 29 year history and is the largest comprehensive test of Japanese-language skills for non-native speakers. This time, the JLPT will take place in 65 countries and regions.

December 2013 JLPT

- 1. Test Date: Sunday, December 1, 2013
- 2. Test Sites: 203 cities in 64 countries and regions abroad and 44 prefectures in Japan
- 3. Test Levels: N1~N5 (5 levels with N1 being the highest)
- 4. Number of Applicants: Over 355,000 people (Approximately 280,000 overseas and 75,000 in Japan)

•New city for the JLPT in December 2013: Siem Reap (Cambodia), Algiers (Algeria), Antananarivo (Madagascar)

Ways to Utilize JLPT Certificates

- Points granted for preferential treatment in Japan's emigration and immigration management of highly skilled foreign professionals (N1)
- ✓ Japan-Vietnam EPA: Selection criterion for immigration of nurses and care workers (N3 or higher)
- Certified qualification for taking the National Medical Practitioners Qualifying Examination organized by the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare (N1)
- ✓ Certified qualification for taking the Practical Nurse Licensing Examination (N1)
- ✓ Preferential treatment at universities, job placement, etc.
